

ARTICLE 22 – REPEALS AND CONSTITUTIONALITY

SECTION 2201 INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES REPEALED

All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter are hereby repealed insofar as they are inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

SECTION 2202 CONSTITUTIONALITY

If any Article, Section, subsection, paragraph, clause or phrase of this chapter for any reason shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, the decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this ordinance.


The City Council of the City of Isleton hereby declares that it would have enacted this chapter and each Article, Section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause and phrase hereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more Articles, Sections, subsections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases are declared to be invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 2: Having certified that the Environmental Assessment related to the zoning ordinance has been considered and filed in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act, the City Council hereby finds that the amendments to the Isleton Municipal Code are required to achieve the requirements of Section 65860 of the California Government Code, which Section requires that a City's zoning ordinance shall be consistent with a City's General Plan, and that this ordinance has been adopted by the City Council after public hearing held on June 13, 2012, at 7:00 p.m. of said day after notice required under the provisions of Section 65856 of the Government Code.

SECTION 3: This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its passage and shall be published in summary in a newspaper of general circulation within the City of Isleton within fifteen (15) days after its passage. Since no newspaper of general circulation is published and circulated within the City of Isleton, the City Clerk is hereby directed and authorized to give public notice of enactment of this ordinance as provided by law by posting a copy of same in three public places within the City, to wit: 101 Second Street, 103 C Street, and 105-107 Second Street.
